While they generally don't start producing fruit as early as determinates do, they do produce a more enduring supply of tomatoes throughout the summer, and often into fall or even winter, until cold weather finally shuts them down.

Indeterminate sentencing used to be the rule in every state and for the federal courts as well. States that practice determinate sentencing prohibit judges from determining the length of an individual's sentence. This is due to minimum sentences that are imposed by law and that depend on the type of crime committed. Similarly, states that practice determinate sentencing prohibit judges from straying from the penalty that is to be imposed. This means that a judge cannot offer probation or another alternative to prison if state law calls for a prison sentence to be imposed.
